Virtual vs. Hybrid

Virtual Instructions- Online instruction will be provided for the duration of the 20-21 school year. Students will still be assigned to Adler as a student.

Hybrid Instructions- Students will receive instruction online until it is safe to return to the brick and mortar. When safe, students will return a couple days per week with an online component. (PPE)

How will instruction be delivered?

Synchronous learning is digital, and online learning where students learn from instructors or peers in **real-time**, but not in person. For example:

- *Scheduled video conferences or group phone calls;*
- *Live streamed lectures or demonstrations;*
- *Scheduled quizzes and tests;*
- *Scheduled chat room time for students to share ideas*

Asynchronous learning refers to students ability to access information, demonstrate what they've learned, and communicate with classmates and instructors on their own time. For example:

- *Independent reading, writing, math assignments;*
- *Recorded presentations;*
- *Working on science or social studies projects;*
- *Completing homework or online assignments*

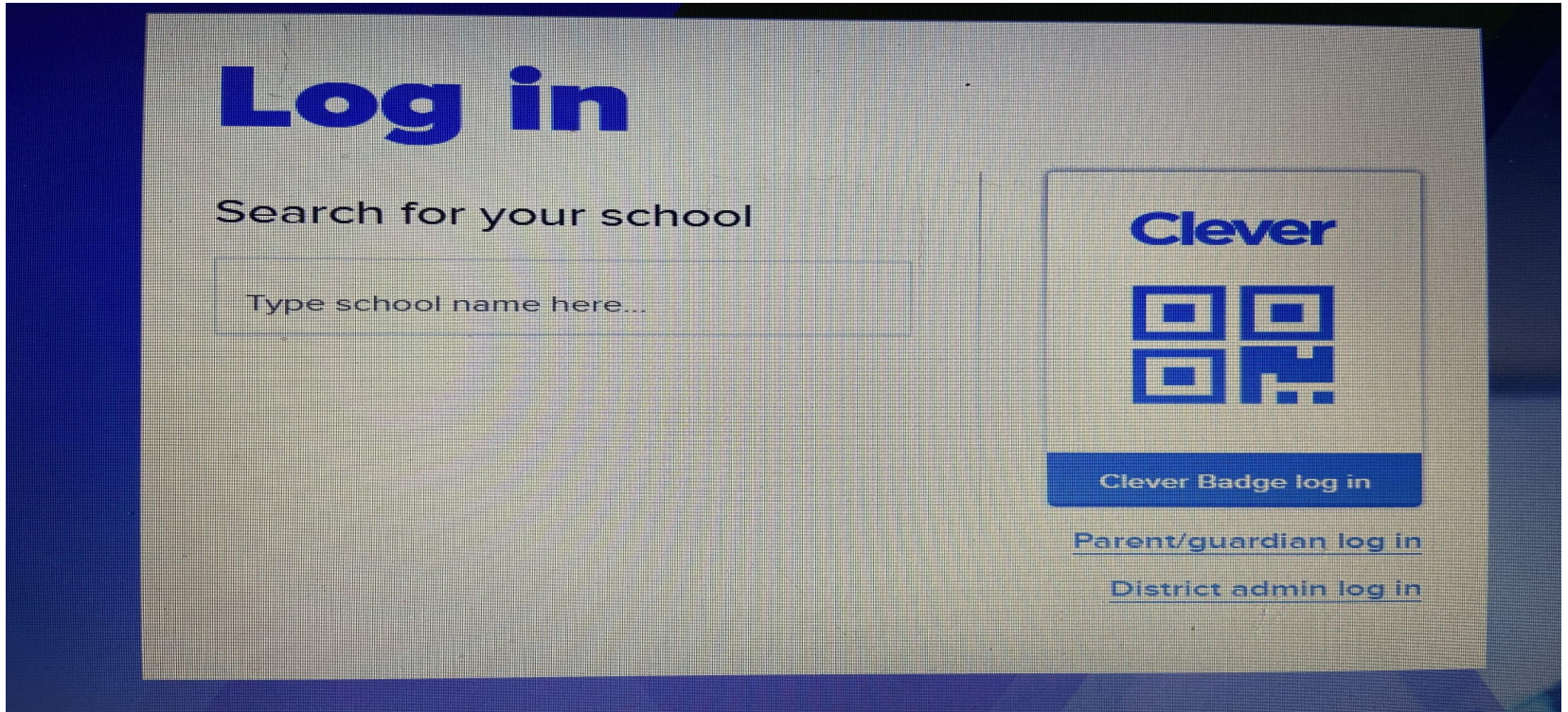



ART CLASS

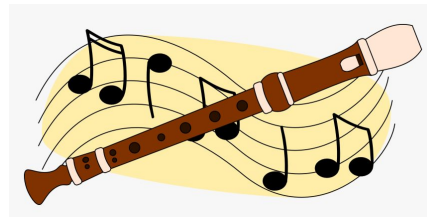
Supply list for Art Class with Ms. Butler

All Students: Crayons, colored pencils, washable markers, drawing paper, eraser, regular black pencil, balloons, watercolor & tempera paint (red, blue, yellow, green orange purple, white, black), glue, paint brushes, notebook, construction paper, masking tape, scissors, white paper plate, clay (air drying), straws, popsicle sticks and toothpicks

K-2nd only: Coloring book, and washable paint instead of tempera paint (red, blue, yellow, green orange purple, white, black) and Legos

Recycle Materials: Plastic water bottles (5), paper bags (5), butter/sour cream/yogurt/milk containers, cardboard paper towel holders (3), toilet paper inserts (6), newspaper, magazines (2), pop bottle tops (10-20), cardboard boxes of various sizes (10), and egg cartons (3).

Supplies for Music Class with Mrs. Busch

Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grades: For our first class we will be making some instruments from items you have around the house. We will make 4 different types of "instruments" which we will be using during music classes. Here are some things you will need. **Always ask your adult BEFORE you take anything to create these instruments.**

ART SUPPLIES: markers, crayons, washi tape, ribbon, glitter glue, other decorating supplies. **SHAKER:** empty water bottle, dried out **OR** plastic Easter egg; dry beans **OR** dry rice **OR** plastic beads **STICKS:** 2 old wooden spoons **OR** 2 sturdy sticks from outside that will fit in your hands **METALS:** 2 soup spoons **OR** 1 soup spoon and a pot lid **OR** Empty dried out soup can **SKINS:** EMPTY- Oatmeal box **OR** coffee can with lid **OR** Cool Whip container

3rd grade: We will be starting recorders in September. You can order a recorder at www.musiciansfriend.com and type Yamaha soprano recorder in the search bar. There is a choice of colors.
