As you are reading, please find ideas that stand out to you. You can also think about the following questions:

What in the book tells you how the characters feel?• Who is your favorite character in the story and why?• What connections can you make between your own life and the characters and situations in this book? What would you want other people to know about this topic?• What new information are you learning?• What more do you want to learn about this topic? What in the text makes you want to learn more about this topic?

Discuss your questions and reactions to the book. Consider making notes on a piece of paper as you are reading or sharing your thoughts with a picture, bookmark, flip-book, padlet, Tik-Tok, Flipgrid. Share these creations with someone. Have fun reading across Southfield in parks, at the Southfield Public Library, or even at the Southfield Pavilion. In August, bring your book to school and be prepared to discuss this with your school community.
